

Bernadette Bartos

Bernadette Bartos studied at the University of Music and Performing Arts in Vienna and finished her concert exam with Heinz Medjimorec and Stephan Möller in June 2010 with the Master's degree, concert exam.

In 2010/2011 she did postgraduate studies at the Royal College of Music with Roger Vignoles and Simon Lepper.

Her master class experiences include training with Klaus Hellwig, Christopher Elton and Noel Flores. Her focus on Lied repertoire was augmented in master classes with Roger Vignoles, Helmut Deutsch, Peter Schreier, Angelika Kirchschlager, Bernarda Fink and Michael Schade.

Since February 2011 she was accepted into Graham Johnson's "Young Songmaker's Almanac". Followed by Lied recitals at the Oxford Lieder Festival (Hollywell Music Room) and at St. John's Smith Square in London with the Bariton Benjamin Appl.

Bernadette Bartos made her debut at the Großer Saal, Wiener Musikverein, with Beethoven's piano concert Nr. 3, in c-minor in March 1999. In 2003 she was awarded the „Musica Juventutis“ prize which was followed by recitals in the Schubert and Mozart Saal at the Vienna Konzerthaus.

Concert performances as a soloist, chamber musician and Lied accompanist have taken Bernadette throughout Slovenia, Slovakia, France, Great Britain, Germany, Switzerland, Netherlands, Italy and Uruguay.

She has performed at festivals such as the International Musicfestival in Brive (France), the Austrian cultural festival in Marcq en Baroeul (France), Carinthischer Sommer in Ossiach, Kulturkreis Niederfellabrunn, „Liszt Fenster“ in Eisenstadt, and the Salzkammergut Festwochen in Gmunden (Austria).

With the violinist Noëlle Gruebler she won the Gwyneth George Award of the Beethoven Society of Europe in Mai 2012.

In September 2012 Wolfgang Holzmaier and Bernadette Bartos were recording Lieder by Benedict Randhartinger. Published by Gramola and release date was March 2013.

Since October 2012 she is playing in Lied-Classes at the Mozarteum University Salzburg.

October 2013 Baritone Matthias Winckler and Bernadette won an exceptional prize at the International Schubert Competition Dortmund.
